#### **Refuse Collection**

As always during a crisis, there are some who seek to take advantage of the vulnerable. Please encourage any neighbours or family members who may be vulnerable to not part with credit cards or sensitive information, and if necessary call the Police.

### Supporting the Community in Wilstead

The Parish Council are aware of volunteers in the village who are able to support those in the high risk groups or who are self isolating with a range of things that might be helpful, such as, collecting prescriptions and shopping etc.

There are also a number of local services who are offering help, and as this information is very fast changing it is very difficult to share before it then becomes out of date. It has been pleasing to see those in need of assistance or

reassurance being linked with volunteers successfully already.

Orange recycling sack stocks are very low, however, if you are in need of some bags then the Councillors are able to respond to residents and during these exceptional circumstances deliver them to you, although we really only have a few rolls left, so please be mindful of others needs.

### **Parish Council Meetings**

The Council did meet in March and were able to put some steps in place to ensure that the Parish Council can continue to function, albeit in a different way.

Unfortunately, the Parish Council need to report that with the current situation, it is expected that changes will need to be made to the previously published meeting schedule.

At the time of writing, it is highly unlikely the April Parish Council will take place, so please check in advance. The Parish Council do have statutory obligations and at present it is looking like May will be the next time the Council meet. As you can understand this brings many challenges so the advice from the National Association of Local Council is being monitored closely.

#### **Highways in the Parish**

It has been pleasing to see the A6 open and the roads of the village return to being quiet. There are still remedial repairs to be carried out to the diversion route through the village. The Parish Council continue to monitor this closely and are regularly liaising with Borough Officers to ensure these works are carried out in a timely manner and to a high standard.



If you have noticed workman in the village making changes to some street lights this is the work being done in order for those Parish owned street lights along the main roads to be transferred to and adopted by the local authority.

### Road Verges

Now that traffic through the village has eased it would be appreciated if residents and their visitors would not drive or park on the road verges. These have in some cases become very rutted and In addition, some residents have unsightly. planted bulbs which enhance the look of the verges considerably. These are in danger of being crushed or destroyed by inconsiderate parking.

### **Longmeadow Drive Play Areas**

The Play Areas along Longmeadow Drive are being upgraded to bring them up to an adoptable standard. Some of the play equipment is now not up to this standard and some areas were never completed.

This work was due to start late March and should be completed in 4 weeks. There will be a container on the grass at the junction of Longmeadow Drive and Church Farm Avenue whilst this work is being done.

The area containing the large play equipment and the large area of tarmac will, for safety reasons, be fenced off during this work because vehicles need access and machinery will be used in this work.

There will also be work on the smaller Local Area of Play (LAP) and a circular seat and tree will be installed where the missing LAP was originally planned.

#### **General Parish Council Work**

Even during this exceptionally busy time, a number of Parish matters are continuing to be worked on and progressed. The Council are involved in the East West Rail and Local Boundary Review Public Consultations, in addition to development of a new Parish Council website which will be ready shortly.

### Village P3 Footpath Group

### Meetings

The next meeting was planned for the 23rd May but that must be doubtful now. See May's Newsletter for update.

At the March meeting the recurring theme in the reports on the 17 Rights of Way around the village was wet, muddy and standing water though all were passable with wellies or walking boots.

Quite a few of the way mark posts along the various paths seem to be rotten/leaning or broken and will be tackled/replaced as soon as the weather and Coronavirus allows.

There weren't too many other problems reported.

### **Coronavirus and Exercise**

With the Coronavirus curtailing most social activities now is a good time to exercise, get some fresh air and explore the surrounding countryside using the 11 miles of footpaths and bridleways which surround the village.

If you would like a copy of the leaflet that shows where these paths are or a copy of the circular walk from Whitworth Way to the edge of Haynes and back the call the number below or pop into the Post Office where some leaflets will be left.

The paths have been wet but are mostly drying out quickly.

### Footpath Work

The state of the paths at the moment still means that any work of the paths, bar snipping off bits of overhanging vegetation, has been difficult. The paths are improving and the group will be undertaking tasks, identified at the meeting in March, in the next few weeks.

In the meantime if you use the footpaths around the village please take secateurs with you and snip the odd overhanging vegetation as you go along. Vegetation is starting to grow and soon will be trying to invade the paths!

### Footpaths across the A6

These footpaths across the A6 have now re-opened. At the time of writing the promised 'Pedestrians Crossing' signs have yet to be installed either side of each of these crossings. The verges have been cleared so visibility has improved but take care when crossing the

road as the new improved smooth surface may well mean that traffic will just go faster!

The 'hoped for' use of the old cattle creep to divert these paths under the A6 is no longer a possibility as it is now filled in as part of the A6 roadworks.

#### Walks

The March walk was due to be along the footpaths and bridleways around Broom but rain intervened. The group had previously done most of this walk in 2006. There were going to be a few changes as some of the paths used back then are now under metres of water because of the recent sand and gravel extraction. But at least we would have had some new bits to walk along. We will try the walk again when the weather and coronavirus allow.

The next planned walks are **Sunday 26th April** and **Friday 29th May** but again these are in some doubt. Keep an eye on the village noticeboards and Newsletter.

### Jackie's Gardening Blog

ne of the direct results of this viral outbreak is that of giving us older people plenty of time to spend in the garden and home, and not use the excuse of being too busy to get outside and do something.

The weather had been kind to us during the middle of March which enabled plenty of work to be done, albeit in a cold and bracing breeze.

Those of you who are members of the Garden Club will remember I did a talk in January about 'No Dig Gardening' and I felt this was a good opportunity to report on how my garden is responding.

At the beginning of February I got a call from a Garden Club member, offering a large quantity of cardboard, to get my 'No Dig' adventure started. This was duly collected and spread out over one of the four raised beds in my front garden.

Encouraged by this, David and I scoured the house and loft for any spare cardboard we had laying around. It's amazing how many redundant cardboard boxes we had in the loft. Often for appliances that had long been sent to the tip! These were all utilised and I was able to cover another raised bed.

There was one bed that had been mulched in grass clippings, which I left, and another (the fruit cage) where it would be difficult to spread cardboard.

The next step was to place an order with Bradshaws of Haynes (01234 740383 if you wish to contact them) for a tonne of compost.

### Be Vigilant to Covid-19 Door to Door Scams

Opportunist thieves may see this period as a time to carry out distraction burglaries, as vulnerable adults and elderly people are spending more time at home following isolation guidance.

Bedfordshire Police has been made aware of people knocking on doors claiming to be selling vaccines and supplies for COVID-19. Do not fall victim to these scams as such items do not exist. For COVID-19 information, for medical advice and what you can do, refer to the NHS website.

We would like everyone to remind elderly and vulnerable relatives, friends and neighbours to take extra care when answering the door to people they do not know.

Remind them, where possible, only answer the door when it is known that a family, friend, carer or prearranged trades person is visiting. Consider installing a door chain and always keep it on.

If unsure of the visitor's identity, they should ask for ID first and telephone the company they are purporting to be from using the local directory or a telephone number provided independently by the service provider. If someone is offering a service make sure they discuss any work that needs to be carried with a relative or friend.

Any suspicious behaviour can be reported by calling 101, visiting the Police online reporting system or by contacting Wilstead Neighbourhood Watch for advice.

What strange times we are living in at the moment. We hope that you are all taking care of yourselves and keeping safe.



### **Borough Councillor Report**

#### 1. A6 Wilstead Bypass

By the time you read this report the A6 will have reopened, after months of repair work. Luton Road Wilstead was closed for a number of weeks, in order to bring that road into line with the new A6. The A6 seems to be missing a lot of greenery, shrubs and trees along the sides of the road. I have asked the Borough whether these are going to be replanted

#### 2. G-Park Planning Application

There is no news yet regarding any decision on the warehousing application. I am continuing to press for a rerouting of all HGVs into Wixams, via a new road beyond the bus-gate and both the Director of Highways and the Borough Chief Executive had agreed to look at the possibility, though it will undoubtedly be an expensive project.

#### 3. Elstow Park & Ride

A number of people have been in touch regarding the Elstow Park & Ride facility. I've therefore spoken to Borough Council officers and asked for an update on what is happening. The details that I currently have are as follows:

- There has been an application made by Enterprise (the car rental company) to convert part of the building/pavilion at the Park and Ride and use some of the parking spaces. This proposal has not yet been agreed by the Borough Council.
- Under the proposal, Enterprise would convert the waiting room and use 60 of the available parking spaces.
- There will still be a sheltered area remaining for people to wait for the bus.
- The toilets will still be available for the public to use
- Most people currently don't use the pavilion and prefer to sit in their cars when waiting for the bus (Apparently this is normal at most Park and Ride schemes).
- There will be a loss of 60 parking spaces from the current 330, taking it down to 270.
- The Park and Ride is rarely used at its maximum capacity other than on a big event day, such as the River Festival
- This proposal does not affect the bus timetable, which is an entirely separate matter and the responsibility of Stagecoach, who run the Park and Ride facility on behalf of the Borough Council

Residents seem concerned that, whilst the two issues are not connected, this proposal may be the

lead in to a reduction in bus services. I don't have a date for when this application will be decided or by whom, but it is a planning matter.

#### 4. Verges – Green Lane

I have chased up the Environment Department regarding the damaged verges in Green Lane. These have now been repaired and re-seeded. There are other damaged verges around Bedford Road and I will continue to press for these to be repaired too.

#### 5. Licensing Application – Herrings Green Farm

An application has been made for a licence at Herrings Green Farm for a stable to be converted to a function room. Comment back from Wilstead seems to suggest that residents are broadly supportive.

#### 6. Coronavirus

I am due to have briefings with senior Borough Council officers (16/3) to ensure local services are resilient and continue. In addition, I am chairing a meeting of the Health Scrutiny Committee (also 16/3) and will be putting questions to the Director of Public health for the Borough. My advice to all Wixams residents is to follow the guidance of Public Health England and other health experts and to look out for friends, neighbours and the elderly.

#### 7. PCC Elections

The Government has postponed the election for Police & Crime Commissioners, which were due to have taken place on 7th May. These have been rescheduled for 2021.

#### 8. Borough Ward Boundary Review

A review of the Borough Council ward boundaries is currently being undertaken as a result of growing population making the wards uneven in terms of electors. Anyone may submit a proposal to the Local Government Boundary Commission. Deadline for responses is Monday 4th May.
