The Parish Council were sad to learn of the recent death of Tony Pedder who was the first Chairman of the newly formed Wixams Parish Council back in 2015/16.

Eric Benton was pleased to represent Wilstead at Tony's funeral celebration on Tuesday 17th December.

#### 244 Houses Proposed For Wilstead...

As detailed previously, residents might be aware of the recent planning application, 24/01566/ MAO an outline planning application for the erection of up to 149 dwellings and associated works at land to the South East of Duck End Lane.

There has also been an application made 24/02231/MAO outline application demolition of existing buildings and erection of up to 95 residential dwellings at land at Village Farm, 85 Cotton End Road.

Both these sites have had speculative applications made on them, back in 2017 and 2018. Whilst neither received planning permission at the time, it is really important residents engage in the planning consultation process for both these sites.

The Parish Council has submitted its detailed objection to both these proposed housing developments.

It will be Bedford Borough Council who consider these more recent applications. If you have not had a chance yet to engage in the consultation process and have your say for both of these applications, there is still time to submit comments to the local authority who will take them on board up until the point of determining the application. Please send your comments to planning@bedford.gov.uk.

#### **Reminder - East West Rail Public Consultation Closes Soon**

Please do take some time to review the supporting documents that form part of the East West Rail consultation, the deadline of the non-statutory consultation is 24th January 2025 which is fast approaching.

East West Rail state that feedback gathered during the consultation will help them further develop and refine the designs, which they will present at a future statutory consultation. The consultation documents can be found at: eastwestrail.co.uk/consultation2024.

It is worth taking some time to have a look at the documents, as although the proposed new section of railway is planned for the north of Bedford, there are a number of changes outlined in the document that will impact the Marston Vale (Bedford to Bletchey) line, plus parking for the main Bedford station being sited on part of the current Bedford Hospital car park. So, it is likely that local travel networks will be impacted during the construction phase, as well as longer term, so it is important to try and help shape the development of this project which will see the railway line electrified as well in the near future. #### **Highways Safety In The Village**

Bedford Borough Council have now completed the removal of the bus stop yellow lineage on Cotton End Road near its junction with Bedford Road close to the crossroads. The rationale for this is to encourage better parking behaviours with the aim of improving highways safety in the village centre, so there are more parking spaces available.

There is due to be a highways site meeting early in the New Year to look to move on a number of highways safety issues, as part of follow up from the highways safety site walk held back in March 2023.





The meeting will have Borough Councillor Ward representation, alongside Parish Councillors and the Manager for Traffic Operations at the Local Authority who are the statutory highways authority with responsibility for the highways network. In addition to pushing forward action on items raised back in 2023 the Parish Council will be continuing to pursue further improvements, such as a village centre 20mph zone and speed limit extension requests at Duck End.

#### **Overflowing Bins In The Parish**

There have been recent reports of a number of dog and general waste bins in the village not being emptied and/or misused.

The Borough Council are responsible for emptying bins in the village, apart from Longmeadow Drive which remains the responsibility of the former developer, Persimmon.

In general, the local authority empty the bins in the village on a regular schedule.

Unfortunately this was disrupted due to some staff changes which resulted for a period time in some areas across the Borough in bins not being emptied in as timely a manner as usual. The operative issues, it is understood, have now been resolved at the local authority, so bins should be back to being emptied regularly.

If you come across an over-flowing bin then please notify the Borough Council. The best way to do this being online, through the website: <a href="https://www.bedford.gov.uk/environment-issues/keeping-bedford-borough-clean/littering-and-bins">www.bedford.gov.uk/environment-issues/keeping-bedford-borough-clean/littering-and-bins</a>, so they can take follow up action.

It has also been disappointing to see the misuse of bins in the village. This spoils it for others who then are unable to access somewhere to responsibly dispose of their litter. Misuse of bins is managed in the same way as fly-tipping. It is taken very seriously by the local authority enforcement Officers who do investigate and use their powers to issue fines to the perpetrators. Please kindly continue to use the bins in the village sensibly, so that they remain accessible for all.

Please note the Parish Office (at the rear of the Village Hall) is open most Mondays, 9am to midday. It is worth ringing in advance to ensure it is open. Please note there will be some closure time over the festive season.

Do not forget it is always more interesting to attend a Parish Council meeting in person to see what goes on and understand the range of items covered in trying to move improvements for the Wilstead community forwards.

Dates and the agenda are advertised on the village noticeboards, with meetings on a Monday starting at 7pm in the small hall at Wilstead Village Hall. (Head to the left-hand side of the main hall building and you will see the door open which is where the Parish Council will be). Everyone is most welcome to join us, on 6th January, 10th February and 10th March.



## WILSTEAD VILLAGE HALL NEEDS YOU NOW, MORE THAN EVER OR IT COULD CLOSE!

At the time of writing this (just before Christmas), we do not have a new caretaker in place and all the bookings since the sad deaths of Brian and Sandra Spinks have been covered voluntarily by members of the Committee. However, this cannot continue and so please, if you are at all interested in the caretaker role, be it only for 1 or 2 days a week, do contact Barbara or Angela (see contact details below).

In May, we will be holding our AGM when a new Committee is formed. If we do not have enough people to volunteer to stand, then the Hall would be threatened with closure because it cannot operate without a Management Committee.
