In our 'new normal' lifestyle and as Wilstead Village Hall has now been opened with Covid-19 procedures in place, the Management Committee are now calling everyone to a delayed AGM which should have taken place in May 2020.

Our Village Hall is the very heart of our community. It enables local organisations and clubs to meet and provides the space for parties and family gatherings. The Hall is used by a variety of clubs, organisations and individuals and it is gradually being used again.

It is managed by a team of local residents who volunteer a small amount of their time to ensure the Hall is kept available for local activities and private events. The team keeps the Hall in good order, makes sure bookings are well managed and agrees the fees charged.

New members with extra hands and new ideas are always needed. It's a friendly team, being made up of 3 elected officers, Chair, Secretary and Treasurer; 6 elected members; and representatives of local and regular user groups. Every regular user group is entitled to send a delegate to the Committee meetings. We meet about 5 – 6 times a year but in addition we are in communication with each other on a regular basis during this time, to deal with any issues that can't wait for the next meeting. New Safety Cameras in the Village

The Parish Council automatically receive a payment called a Community Infrastructure Levy when new housing development takes place in the Parish. Therefore the development behind Whitworth Way meant the Parish Council were in receipt of a sizeable payment to use for Parish infrastructure.

The Parish Council considered what different items the money could be used for being mindful of the statutory requirements on how this money can be used, and wanting to ensure the money was used to bring value to the community. There is only so much play equipment, bus shelters benches etc., the Village needs, and the money was not enough to pay for average speed cameras, so the Parish Council needed different items to be identified making sure the money was spent correctly.

During the initial consideration by the Parish Council, CCTV in the Village was identified as a project which would bring additional safety to all residents rather than other projects which might help only certain sections of the residents.

Following research into the associated costs of installing equipment, it would also leave funds for the Parish Council to pursue other project(s) of benefit to the parish.

The CCTV equipment recently installed at the Crossroads will also be able to record images from cameras at the entry to the village, so in the event of crimes or incidents the police will be able to access the recordings. The capability of the Crossroads equipment to capture images from the Jubilee Field, where there has been reports of drugs, anti social behaviour, and littering, is currently being considered by the Council and will be discussed at the next meeting on **Monday 7th September**.

Fly Tipping in the Parish

The Parish Council are aware that there have been several recent fly tipping incidents at the recycling facility at the Bedford Road layby. This

Longmeadow Drive Play Area and Muga

The Parish Council have been receiving communications recently from residents concerned over these areas not being fully accessible. This area and all the surrounding open space off the Longmeadow Drive development is in fact the responsibility of Persimmon.

The Parish Council do continue to communicate the concerns from local residents on to Persimmon, and would encourage residents to bring matters to their attention as they arise.

The Borough Council and Parish Council are working together to try and keep the improvement works going forwards so that the open space and recreational facilities can at a future point be adopted. However, this is a complicated and often lengthy process, which is not always fast moving as it is reliant on timely communication and progress of items raised.

Inconsiderate Parking on Highway Verges

The Parish Council would like to kindly remind all residents to park considerately in the Village, being mindful of the highway verges. Parking vehicles on a grass verge can seem not to cause harm, however, it does do a lot of damage to the open spaces and landscaped areas which are to enhance the rural setting.

Current Bedford Borough Local Plan Options and Issues Consultation

The Parish Council would like to thank local residents who recently engaged in the Borough Council Local Plan consultation. The Parish Council responded outlining that an approach using a combination of the proposals would best support growth in the Borough.

Also within the response it was again highlighted that it is vital that Wilstead does not become





coalescence with neighbouring parishes such as Wixams, Elstow and Eastcotts. The rural identify of Wilstead must be retained. The Parish Council also reiterated that the village must no longer be classified as a Key Rural Service Centre and Parish Council representatives met with a number of Senior Planning Policy Officers to explicitly explain why.

Footpath Work

The warm weather and the increasing number of people walking the paths around the village has meant that most of the paths have been easy to use. A small amount of mowing and work to increase the visibility of the route of the paths has been undertaken. To increase this visibility a number of yellow tops have been added to way mark posts and numerous faded way mark discs have been replaced. These plastic yellow caps should also help preserve the posts.

The recent weather has meant that brambles and other vegetation have quickly grown across some paths in places so please, if you can, take secateurs with you on your walks and snip these off.

If you spot any problems with the path surface or overgrowth then please contact the number below and the group will try and address it.

A6

The filling in of the existing underpass / cattle creep beneath the A6 finally removed the possibility to create a safer crossing of the A6 from the two public footpaths, Wilstead FP3 and FP4, which go to Houghton Conquest by diverting them through this underpass.

The existing crossings are currently safer as all the vegetation in the verge of the A6 has been cleared giving better visibility for both drivers and walkers. Overtime this vegetation will grow back and so the group will continue to request for the wording 'Pedestrians Crossing' to be added to the new signs either side of where these footpaths cross.

Walks

The August walk was cancelled because of the virus. Hopefully the walk on **Sunday 27th September** will be possible though it will mean car sharing is doubtful. The walk will probably be around Woburn or somewhere similar with a large car park. Meet at Whitworth Way car park at 2.00pm.

Being outside and socially distancing should provide a safe environment.

Greensand Surgery Flu Clinics 2020

We are now booking for our flu clinics for those patients in the at risk groups (all patients who are over 65 or under 65 and have asthma, diabetes, heart problems, breathing problems, renal disease or a BMI 40 or above or any other chronic illness, or are a carer for an elderly or disabled person or are currently pregnant).

We would like to reassure our patients that we put your safety first. This is why our clinics will be different than previous years as we are following government guidelines.

- Extremely vulnerable (previous shielding) patients will be offered early morning slots.
- One way system into and out of the surgery will be in place.
- Abiding by the 2 metre rule.
- Markers will be on the floor for patients to stand and queue and more forward when called. You may be required to queue outside for a short period.
- Patients not to attend earlier than their appointment time to avoid unnecessary long queues and crowding.
- We ask patients not to attend the practice if they or a member of their family has any COVID symptoms such as fever, cough, loss of sense of taste or smell.
- Facing coverings to be worn please.
- Please wear short sleeved easy to remove clothing to facilitate easy vaccination.

Appointments are now available to book via our online system (if you have a system one password), or call **01525 631390**.

Please do not call the practice before 11:00 and please avoid Monday mornings, due to the high volume of phone calls.

If you have an online password, we would like to encourage you to book online. No other problem can be dealt with at this appointment time.

Saturday 3rd October at Greensand Surgery (Under 65s at risk) plus Children 2 and 3 years old, and at risk children over 12 years.

If you are housebound where possible can you please organise for a family member or friend to bring you to the surgery in their car for a pre-booked Practice Nurse appointment. This can be arranged during the week at a time suitable for you. The Nurse can vaccinate you in the car. If this is not possible then a sometime home visit will be organised later. Please call **01525 631390**, **Option 2**.

On the 24th July the Government announced new eligible groups entitled to the flu jab, including 50-64 year olds. Greensand Surgery would like to advise our patients that 50-64 year olds will not be eligible for a flu vaccination until November/December subject to vaccine supply, as stated in the National flu letter dated 4th August 2020. This extension is being phased to allow us to prioritise those in at risk groups first.

Outbuilding and Garage Security

As the county eased out of lockdown, many people returned to work or left the house for longer periods leaving their homes and gardens unattended. In the first few weeks, Bedfordshire Police saw an upturn of theft from garages and outbuildings with power tools and lawnmowers often being the target.

During lockdown, there has been a reported increase in householders tackling home and garden improvement jobs and possibly new equipment was what is attracting thieves.

Shed and garage security is all important and it is worthwhile giving your outbuildings and garden boundaries a 'health check':

Check your locks and bolts – replace any rusty items, ensure all padlocks and hasps bear the British Standard kite mark and are made of hardened steel.

Don't forget the hinges on your doors — if a burglar can't breach the lock, they may attempt to unscrew the hinges. Use coach bolts, non-return screws or simply damage the screw head; you don't need to do every screw, just a couple on the hanging plate and a couple on the door plate.

Remember to secure outbuilding windows — even the ones that don't open can be vulnerable. Consider obscuring the window with an opaque window film (the type used to obscure bathroom windows) as this will reduce the temptation. Alternatively, fit a grille or a couple of bars across the inside of the window to reduce the window aperture.

Consider using a battery-operated siren alarm in your outbuildings - they often cost less than £20 and are simple to install and use.

Get into the good habit of putting everything away when you have finished with it. Your own tools can be used to break into your storage.

Repair any damage to fencing and gates.

Have you thought about security marking your tools? Whilst property marking cannot prevent your goods from being stolen by itself, it is a very good deterrent as it is difficult to sell on stolen property that has been marked. It also allows the Police to return recovered stolen goods to their rightful owner and secure a charge. You can also use an approved online asset register such as

Items such as garden furniture, power tools and heaters can be marked by etching or scratching your postcode on to them, or with a permanent marker pen. As a lot of tools end up in the second-hand trade, you may wish to write 'Offered For Sale? Call (phone number)' on the item instead. Alternatively, there are chemical DNA-based marking products such as SelectaDNA and SmartWater.

Oliver Street Surgery Flu Vaccination Clinics from September 2020

We are currently offering flu vaccination appointments for all our patients within the 'at risk' group.

To ease the booking of flu vaccinations for patients and staff, we are offering patients *who are eligible for a flu vaccine* (please see criteria below), to book their appointment online where possible.

We will be running two **Saturday clinics**, **26th September and 10th October.** These are now available to book online.

Am I at increased risk from the effects of flu?

Flu can affect anyone but if you have a long-term health condition the effects of flu can make it worse even if the condition is well managed and you normally feel well. You should have the free flu vaccine if you are:

pregnant

or have a long term condition such as:

- a heart problem
- a chest complaint or breathing difficulties, including bronchitis, emphysema or severe asthma
- a kidney disease
- lowered immunity due to disease or treatment (such as steroid medication or cancer treatment)
- liver disease
- had a stroke or a transient ischaemic attack (TIA)
- diabetes a neurological condition, eg multiple sclerosis (MS), cerebral palsy
- a learning disability
- a problem with your spleen, eg sickle cell disease, or you have had your spleen removed
- are seriously overweight (BMI of 40 and above)

People on the NHS Shielded Patient List for COVID-19 are all eligible for a free flu vaccine and it is really important this year that they receive it.

This list of conditions isn't definitive. It's always an issue of clinical judgement. Your GP can assess you to take into account the risk of flu making any underlying illness you may have worse, as well as your risk of serious illness from flu itself.

Please note that **both the Clinics above will be at the Oliver Street Surgery.** The Practice is unable to offer a site at Wilstead due to the current infection controls in place for Covid.

Steps You Can Take to Protect Your Motorcycle

Use two or more security measures and reduce your risk of becoming a victim

Remove the keys

Always use the steering lock and remove the ignition keys.

Lock your bike

Use a chain lock through the back wheel, to an immovable object such as a ground anchor, railings or lamp post. Or thread the chain through your bike frame and back wheel if the design allows it. Use a disc lock to secure the front brake disc to stop it from being wheeled away. Use a grip lock to secure the brake and throttle controls.

Use a cover

Using a bike cover means thieves can't see if it's a model they are interested in

Fit an alarm

A Thatcham-rated 1 or 2 alarm system with tracking, immobilisation, anti-grab and movement sensors can help protect and trace your vehicle and could reduce your insurance premiums.

Property mark the parts

Mark as much of your bike as possible to make more difficult for criminals to sell parts. It will also help police identify parts and return recovered stolen bikes.

Keep Your Vehicle In Your Garage Or Shed

Fit a garage door defender and upgrade garage door locks. An alarm as well as dusk to dawn lighting will enhance security.

No Shed or Garage? Park in the Safest Place you can

Park it in an area where it's overlooked with good lighting.

Help to Reduce Further Crime

If your bike is stolen, never put yourself at risk. Call police immediately on 999 if you see it being stolen or 101 if you discover it has gone.
