### **Wilshamstead Parish Council**

#### Planning Permission Granted For Up To 95 **Houses On Cotton End Road**

Bedford Borough Council Planning Committee undertook a site visit to Cotton End Road to review the site as part of the Committee's deliberation process. On 14th July the Committee then disappointingly agreed to grant permission for the site. So permission has been approved for demolition of existing buildings and erection of up to 95 residential dwellings at Village Farm, 85 Cotton End Road. This sets a precedent for future applications in Wilstead and other parishes across the Borough. Borough Ward Councillors are liaising with Senior Borough Council Officers to challenge this planning decision.

There will need to be a further application to determine greater details within the site, so there will be a further opportunity to engage in that consultation process, with items such as site layout, housing types and facilities on site expected at that stage.

The Parish Council will continue to monitor this site closely to ensure residents are made aware of any further planning applications, providing updates as usual across a range of different platforms.

#### Wilshamstead Parish **Neighbourhood Plan Review**

Councillors again discussed the importance of safeguarding the parish against speculative planning applications in light of the current outline planning approval. Unexpected changes to national and local planning policy framework meant the Parish Council had taken pro-active steps to look at expediting a suitable review to guide the plan review through.

Parish Councillors were also very mindful that the cost of this work is significant, it will take several months to action and may not be fruitful. In light of the existing planning applications already submitted in Wilstead, it was unanimously agreed to engage the services of a planning consultant to provide professional support in putting forward more technical and robust challenge to the local authority to the next application expected to be determined at Duck End Lane.







## Planning Application For Up To 149 Houses At Duck End Lane

With amended plans recently submitted to the local authority for the 24/01566/MAO Outline application for the erection of up to 149 dwellings and associated works at Land On The East Of Duck End Lane, the Parish Council will seek professional input to expand the response to this application further. It is felt this is the best way to approach these applications being submitted to Bedford Borough Council as the Parish Council remain committed to safeguarding the village from unsuitable development.

#### Parking Restrictions Consultation Update

The Parish Council, Borough Council Highways Officers, and Borough Ward Councillors have been looking at how to improve highways safety around the centre of the village. Six members of the public responded to a public consultation held on the proposals with the Parish Council carefully considering these representations. A vote was taken that resulted in a majority supporting the parking restrictions as advertised within the consultation to be implemented. This feedback will be shared with the local authority for them to take forward as necessary.

Councillors agreed pursuing a 20mph zone for the village centre including outside the primary school, and additional white lineage in the village centre to further promote highways safety. These will be taken to the local authority. The white lines do not require a public consultation, but when implemented will have coverage along parts of Church Road, Cotton End Road and Whitworth Way.

The Parish Council have agreed to make a financial contribution to enable these works to be actioned as the Borough Council have confirmed they do not have sufficient budget resources available for the 20mph or white line work to take place. The Parish Council wish to show their commitment to improving highways safety through these works.

## Do You Like Gardening And Have A Few Spare Hours...?

The Parish Council are extremely grateful to the wonderful volunteers from the village who have kindly stepped forward to form the great Wilstead Wombles, keeping the village free from litter.

There was also a number of residents who now carry out checks on the defibrillators located across the village to help the devices remain available for all to access if needed.

The Parish Council would like to welcome anyone who might have a little free time and enjoy gardening to take care of the small area in front of the village entrance signs to improve the welcome visitors receive as they enter the village. There are three signs in total, in Luton Road, Bedford Road and Cotton End Road. There would be no cost for any flowers or plants used, the Parish Council would cover the cost of these items.




