There is no need to fret about what to do with your real Christmas tree after the festivities have ended, as Sue Ryder St John's Hospice in Moggerhanger, is offering a green scheme to recycle it.

You will also hopefully have started to spot the new Village noticeboards that have been recently installed throughout various locations in the Village. These new boards were funded by both the Parish Council and Borough Councillor Ward Fund.

In addition, now the nesting season is over, the Parish Council is using this time to ensure that a number of hedges and nearby areas in need of maintenance across the Parish are being cut back thoroughly.

### **Community Woodland Latest**

For many years the Council has been pursuing, with the Wixams developer, the generation and improvement of the Community Woodland off Duck End Lane, promised as part of the developers contribution and commitment when Wixams was very first being planned.

Thankfully, more recently, things have moved forwards, not only with the planting of the woodland, but also with the discussions on the future management of the woodland site. It has for some time been the intention of the Parish Council to adopt this area, taking on the responsibility to ensure it is safeguarded for many future Village generations to enjoy. This is now a step further forwards and the Parish Council have formally agreed to take this land on, with the corresponding legal process under way. Updates on how this progresses will be published in future Newsletters and on the Parish Council website.

#### Bedford Borough Local Plan 2040 And Wilstead Neighbourhood Plan

The Borough Council has advised that they have received hundreds of comments with reference to their draft Local Plan. They are still working on how to incorporate these into the Plan and do not expect to be able to issue a revised draft until the Spring of 2022. At this time we also expect to receive an indication of whether Wilstead will be required to accommodate additional housing development between 2023 and 2040. If this were the case, the Neighbourhood Plan Team and Parish Council would work together on determining the recommended location for any development.

At the moment the draft Neighbourhood Plan contains no additional development recommendations before 2030 – in line with the existing Borough Local Plan 2030. The Neighbourhood Plan Team are currently working on incorporating all comments received following the consultation with Villagers, land owners and businesses over the course of 2021. The revised Plan will then go to Referendum in the Village early in the New Year.



# **Wilstead Methodist Church**

As many of you are aware, Wilstead Methodist Church was initially closed in the first lock down in March 2020 when all churches were asked to remain closed. Although there have been a number of changes that have allowed for churches to consider being open, to do this has continued to present challenges.

Work to maintain and manage the premises has fallen to an increasingly small group of older volunteers meaning that, even with help with practical tasks, being open in the current circumstances did not feel realistic.

This has meant we have had to have some very difficult conversations as a church about how practical reopening really is for us both now and into the future. It is therefore with great sadness that I now share we have taken the very difficult decision to say we cannot continue. This is not a decision we have taken lightly and it causes us great pain to say it. We are grateful for all the community support we have had and ask that you think of us at this time just as we continue to think and pray for the wider Wilstead community.

In practical terms, it will take time to look at what happens next and that will need to involve the local Circuit that Wilstead Methodist is part of. We will need to be guided in all matters by charity law and the requirements of the Charity Commission.

My prayer is that you all continue to stay safe and well in these difficult times.

# Update from Wilstead Village Agent

Village Agents provide a free, confidential service and are here to help people over 65 with a variety of issues – large or small. We are funded by Bedford Borough Council. We are all DBS checked and operate in the strictest confidence. Andrea is the Village Agent for Wilstead.

**Prevent scam bank phone calls** – if you are concerned about a call alleging to be from your bank a new phone service is available to put you straight through to your bank. Call 159 and listen to the list of participating banks. Most major banks are taking part in the scheme. Remember, never give your account details to anyone you don't know or are not expecting to call you, it's probably a scam.

**Would a helpful gadget make your life easier?** – do you need a disabled toilet key, personal safety alarm, a handy grabber for picking up items or a 'good grip' potato peeler suitable for arthritic hands? Andrea has a few useful items to give away free, but be quick before they all go!

**Struggling to feed yourself this winter?** – Andrea can issue Foodbank vouchers for those who are in genuine need due to benefits delays/sanctions. Any age group applies. Please call in confidence

**Help with form filling** – many older people aren't claiming the benefits they are entitled to. Andrea can help identify which benefits you can claim by doing a confidential benefits check. We can also help you fill in those complicated forms such as Blue Badge and Attendance Allowance forms. We are now able to carry out face to face indoor visits, or we can provide telephone support and advice.

## Top Tips For Being Better Gas Safe Than Sorry

- Learn the six main symptoms of carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning - headaches, nausea, dizziness, breathlessness, collapse and loss of consciousness and teach them to others, including your neighbours. Unsafe gas appliances can put you at risk of CO poisoning, gas leaks, fires and explosions.
- 2. Check your and your neighbours' gas appliances for warning signs that they are not working properly e.g. lazy yellow flames instead of crisp blue ones, black sooty marks or stains on or around the appliance and high levels of condensation in the room.
- 3. Fit an **audible carbon monoxide alarm**. This will alert you if there is carbon monoxide in your home.
- Have all your gas appliances safety checked every year by a Gas Safe registered engineer – sign up for a free reminder.
- 5. Only use a **Gas Safe registered engineer** to fit, fix and service your gas appliances. You can find and check an engineer at GasSafeRegister.co.uk or call 0800 408 5500. Check their Gas Safe Register ID card look for the yellow triangle.
- If you suspect carbon monoxide poisoning, get some fresh air and leave the house as quickly as possible. See a doctor and if you are very unwell call 999 for an ambulance. The National Gas Emergency Helpline is also available 24/7 on 0800 111 999.
