Universal Studios Recent Announcement

Following the recent public announcement about Universal Studios building a new theme park at the former Stewartby brickworks site, the Parish Council is mindful that whilst this will bring a lot of excitement and opportunity to the local area, it may also bring some worry and uncertainty to the local community, particularly around impact on the local road network which is already busy.

Engagement from senior staff at Universal Studios with Bedford Borough Council as well as with Borough Councillors has already been forthcoming, with Universal staff making themselves accessible and willing to answer any questions and understanding importance of community engagement. Parish Councillors have already been invited to and attended a face-to-face meeting with representatives which was done so that Universal could understand first-hand the concerns from Wilstead. Universal are meeting with each local parish individually to hear any worries and offer reassurance on how these items will be managed in the planning and development phases.

The application in terms of planning permissions will be administered through central government and not the local authority, with a target build timeline of 2027 through to a projected opening in 2030. It's anticipated there will be up to 30,000 construction jobs created, 10-12,000 full time jobs when the park is open, and we're told each job has a knock-on effect of a further 1.5 jobs in the local community.

The management of visitors and employees to the theme park are a key part of the infrastructure considerations which involve looking at access routes, as well as light and noise pollution. The Parish Council is assured that transport infrastructure is a key part of their plan, the Universal business is built on return visitors, so it's not in their interests to have a poor transport experience. We have also been reassured with regard to noise and the design of the site such that you can't hear noise from one part of the park to the other, so it won't bleed over into surrounding villagers.

Borough Ward Councillors are heavily involved with this project and the Parish Council will be closely monitoring the development of this proposal, even at this very early initial stage, and will keep residents up to date through the usual different platforms with information.



Bedford Borough Council Local Plan Latest

As advised in the previous article the Government Inspector appointed by the Secretary of State who heard numerous local representations on the Borough Local Plan throughout June and September 2023, including representations from Wilshamstead Parish Council, deemed the intended local planning strategy framework up to 2040 not to be sound. The Parish Council understands that Borough Council Planning Policy Officers are continuing to work hard on the next steps with at the time of writing no formal announcement made on what these are to be.

It is expected the update on the Local Plan next steps will be made by the Borough Council by March 2024, and it is also expected that the December announcement from Universal Studios intending to build a theme park in Bedford borough will be a factor that is now included in the strategic planning framework document.

Reminder Grants For Rural Businesses And Organisations

Local grants awarded from a new initiative called the Rural England Prosperity Fund can provide capital funding to:

- support new and existing rural businesses to develop new products and facilities that will be of wider benefit to the local economy. This includes farm businesses looking to diversify income streams.
- support new and improved community infrastructure, providing essential community services and assets for local people and businesses to benefit the local economy.

The funding levels available are up to £5,000 and £25,000 depending on your project, it would be really great to see important local village matters identified, and improvements made, through the use of this fund. It is part of a campaign that is working on:

- Provide property marking burglary reduction packages to community officers and Bobby scheme to issue to vulnerable residents/victims of burglary.
- Provide property marking business security packs to farms and businesses in rural areas via officers when they are dealing with vulnerable victims or a victim of theft.
- Invest in training in Watch Schemes throughout Beds and expand to create a rural watch scheme enabling residents to become additional visible deterrents and collate information and intelligence to submit to the force.



Wilstead Endowed Charities - Tea Party

Although a provisional date of 13th March for the 2024 Tea Party was proposed before Christmas, the amount of organising still to do by a reduced number of Trustees means that there is some uncertainty that all the arrangements can be made in time.

Therefore, to be on the safe side, it has been decided to have a Tea Party later in the year.

As well as giving the Trustees more time to organise a 2024 Tea Party that will compare favourably with previous Tea Parties it will mean that everyone will be able to get home in daylight, (even the clearer-uppers!). Apologies if you had planned around the provisional 13th March date. Hopefully the Trustees will be able to confirm a summer date (i.e. May, June or July) in the next Newsletters.

Trustees and Money

Normally, as per the rules of the Charities formalised with the Charity Commission in 1895, there are nine Trustees. Five are Representative Trustees who are nominated by the Parish Council and three more are nominated by these Representative Trustees. The remaining Trustee is normally the Vicar of All Saints Church, Wilstead or in their absence a member of the Parochial Church Council.

The first benefaction/gift was by William Tompson who left money in his will to set up the Charities in 1596. This gift was the 'rent from a cottage where George Linford lived' 'and from a meadow called Crossmeade'.

These rents provided in total £5 per year to be distributed amongst the poor of the Parish. £2.50 at Christmas and £2.50 at Easter.

Over the centuries further gifts of money, land and property were made to the Charities which provided money for the Church, the Education of village children as well as more money for the Poor. In the early 20th century most of these assets were disposed of and the money invested, leaving the Charities with a ten acre field, Crowsley's Field, which is between Wilstead and Elstow.

How the Charity was run prior to 1895 is somewhat 'lost in the mist of time'.

Currently the Charities income is around £1,000 per annum which is distributed amongst the three branches of the Charities. The Education branch income is spent on things for Wilstead School, The Church part of the income goes to All Saints Church and the Poor part of the income is now spent on the Tea Party.

Previous to circa 2000 the Poor income was distributed amongst 10 poor parishioners who received around £10 each at Christmas. The Trustees decided that identifying who were the ten poorest residents was difficult and so the Tea Party for all the older residents of the village was started.





Footpath Group Meetings

The February meeting of the Group was on the 3rd, between when this input was generated and the Newsletter publication. There would have been reports on all the paths around the Village. I expect some of these would be reporting large puddles, (small lakes in some places!), but generally no paths being impassible.

Wellies, walking/stout boots/shoes are always advisable on the paths around the Village at this time of the year. Bedfordshire clay is good for creating puddles/mud as well as bricks!

The following meeting is in the Village Hall (small hall) on **Saturday 6th April** 10.00am. All are welcome. Come along if you would like to know more about joining in and helping to look at the condition of one of the seventeen paths.

A two monthly check on all the paths in the Parish is undertaken by members of the Footpath Group. Each member is allocated a path and each member's path is changed every two meetings. Maps of individual paths are provided as well as a survey form to fill in highlighting the path's condition and any work needed on it.

The provisional calendar for the remaining 2024 Meetings is overleaf.

Saturdays 1st June, 3rd August, 5th October, 7th December. (10.00am in Village Hall).

Working Parties

Working Parties over the winter have been curtailed by the weather. In fact we haven't had a working party in the last few months. Still none of the paths around the Village have been made difficult to use because of undergrowth and/or overgrowth. This in part was due to the weather and also due to the working parties during the last few years which have kept the footpaths walkable and horse rideable/cycleable/walkable on bridleways).

A new list of Working Party dates should be available after the meeting on 3rd February. Come along to one if you fancy helping keep the paths around the Village usable for the majority of people. Unfortunately as these paths are often along field edges, they can be uneven and are unsurfaced ie no tarmac! For some with mobility problems these could prove a challenge. However the Carriage Drive up to Wilstead Woods off Cotton End Road and bridleway to Elstow (opposite Elms Lane) do offer good surfaces which should suit everyone.

If you notice a problem on the footpaths and bridleways around the Village please call the number below and the Group can then look to see how it can be resolved.

Walks

The November walk was between Sundon and Sharpenhoe. The weather was sunny and the walk gave great views across the Bedfordshire countryside. The New Years Day walk was along paths around the Village. The recent wet weather meant that in order to avoid wading, the length of the walk was reduced to around three and a half miles but it still gave the opportunity to get some fresh air especially for those who had over indulged the evening before!

The **Sunday 11th February** walk is planned to be around Streatley so hopefully the weather will be kind!

These walks will be 4-5 miles long. Meet at Whitworth Way Car Park. All are welcome on these walks and if you are coming along please wear stout shoes or walking shoes/boots.
