Wilshamstead Parish Council Average Speed Camera Data

As detailed previously the Parish Council are reliant on this speed data being shared on by Bedford Borough Council from Bedfordshire Police and unfortunately on occasions this does not happen in a timely or consistent manner. However, the Parish Council are optimistic going forwards this information is able to be received more promptly, this means the Parish Council are pleased to be in a position to feedback the data for some of the cameras in Wilstead.

The latest data received was for February 2025 and shows the levels of speeding along Cotton End Road who have only recently had cameras installed at this location:

It is looking like the facility will be serving Wilstead towards the end of May, with the Parish Council looking to publicise the final dates once the Borough Council have confirmed them in due course, this will be done across a range of different platforms.

Universal Studios Announcement

Following the recent announcement by Universal Destinations and Experiences, a unit of Comcast NBCUniversal, that it intends to build and operate the company's first-ever theme park and resort in the United Kingdom, located in Bedford, pending planning consent approvals, the Parish Council were grateful to receive invitations to attend the recent announcement event in Bedford.

The proposed plans include an entertainment resort complex with a world-class theme park with several themed lands featuring Universal's distinct brand of immersive storytelling, thrilling rides, innovative attractions and exciting entertainment. Initial resort plans also feature a 500-room hotel and a retail, dining and entertainment complex. It will be the first Universalbranded theme park in the UK and Europe.

The projects will have a transformational impact for Bedford, the wider region and the UK, generating nearly £50 billion of economic benefit, unlocking significant local transportation upgrades, and creating thousands of new, high-quality jobs. Local residents received a letter containing more information as well as more being available on their website universalukproject.co.uk.

The Parish Council will continue to engage and monitor the development of this project as it moves forwards and starts to take shape.

Parish Council Work Updates

There remains ongoing dialogue with the Borough Council regarding the highways safety proposals for the village around the village centre such as greater double yellow line coverage and a 20mph zone for the village centre as well as some proposals in other parts of the village. These proposed items will be publicly consulted on so all members of the Wilstead community can engage in the consultation process and have their say.

- Continued work being undertaken to improve the recently acquired land off Bedford Road, to be known as Huckle's Meadow in preparation for having the area open for public access in the near future.
- Contracts confirmed for the village grass areas, along with the hedge maintenance for this forthcoming season.
- Continued engagement with parish planning applications received (all Parish Council comments are available on the Borough Council website planning portal section).







- Follow up work being done to expedite the monies owed from the developers contribution as part of the original infrastructure work promised to the local residents to enable the community woodland, now known as Jacob's Wood to be planted and maintained in the coming years.

Please note the Parish Office (at the rear of the Village Hall) is open most Mondays, 9am to midday. It is worth ringing in advance to ensure it is open.

It is always more interesting to attend a Parish Council meeting in person to see what goes on and understand the range of items covered in trying to move improvements for the Wilstead community forwards. Dates and the agenda are advertised on the village noticeboards, with meetings usually on a Monday starting at 7pm in the small hall at Wilstead Village Hall. (Head to the lefthand side of the main hall building and you will see the door open which is where the Parish Council will be). Everyone is most welcome to join us, with next meetings scheduled for 12th May, 16th June and 21st July.

P3 Footpath Group Meetings

There was a quick meeting of the Footpath Group in the Village Hall on 5th April.

The condition of each of the many Public Footpaths and Public Bridleways which surround the village was reported on, following their inspections by members of the group.

Whilst none of these 17 Rights of Way were impassible or even difficult to go along these inspections highlighted where improvements could be made and areas to keep an eye on if we have a wet late Spring!

Also all of the furniture on the paths, be they kissing gates, finger posts, waymark posts and the few small bridges, were reported to be in good/reasonable condition.

Any proposed improvements mainly consisted of cutting back overhanging vegetation and replacing faded way mark discs.

The next bi-monthly meetings are on Saturday 14th June and Saturday 2nd August in the Village Hall (small hall) at 10.00am.

There will again be a report on each of the footpaths and bridleways around the village including their current ease of use. If problems are identified then plans to address these will be discussed. If any of these problems are too large for the Group to address or extra waymarking/path furniture is needed then help will be sought from Bedford Borough.

Come along if you want to know where the paths are, we have some path leaflets, and/or if you are interested in helping to keep these paths around the village usable and see what this entails. This could be doing a visual survey every couple of months to identify any problems and / or help resolve the problems with other members of the group

All are welcome.

Working Parties

Working Parties to address issues raised at the meetings that the Group can tackle will be arranged. Any materiel needed to resolve these problems, e.g. new waymark posts, will be requested from the Borough Council or purchased by the Group.

If you find any problems when going along the paths and bridleways around the village please contact me, see contact details below.

Walks

The April walk was along paths through Flitwick Moor woodland and along the footpaths to Flitton and back. It was a bit shorter than the normal 5 miles (a 2 hour wander). Whether this was due to the allure of the post walk refreshment or not exactly following the planned route remains uncertain.

The weather was fine and the walk was over firm ground (i.e. no avoiding large puddles). The optional refreshment was found in the White Hart Maulden.

If you want to have a look at Flitton Moor and the woods there is a car park down a track off Maulden Road, Flitwick next to Folly Farm.

Keep an eye on the posters on the village noticeboards for details of future walks.

The next walks will be on Friday 9th May 6.30pm, Friday 13th June 6.30pm and Friday 11th July 6.30pm. Meet in the village car park off Whitworth Way





Why would I do this?

I am a volunteer, and I am writing this article. We have young people and not so young people; we join a family when we volunteer. We have a support network and training. I enjoy being part of a team that are saving lives.

If I am older, such as retired, or younger, say university age, does this matter? Not in the least! As long as you're at least 18 years old. Our younger volunteers gain really valuable experience to put on their CVs and get a reference. Our older volunteers, I am one myself, have the satisfaction of people listening to us, really appreciating our experience and valued as people. I love it!

Do I get training?

All information and training you need to do the role is provided, along with ongoing support from our Volunteer Manager and colleagues. And I think it's world class!

So what will I be doing?

Most of our volunteer roles involve talking to ordinary people about fire safety at home and sharing other important messages that help towards preventing fires starting in the first place, which helps to keep us all safer.

For example, you could be attending local events in Bedfordshire alongside fire service staff and people will want to talk to you about safety, they really do!

What is this going to cost me in time?

We hope you are able to commit at least six hours a month. As a volunteer, you help when you are willing and able to, and volunteering times are by mutual agreement.

Why do you volunteer with the fire service?

I do it because I know it makes a real difference, few things in life matter but this does. I love working within a team and learning new things all the time.





Telephone Migration

There is concern in the community, especially those who are not computer savvy, over the replacement of landlines with digital landlines.

Below is a declaration taken from the Gov.uk website, which may go a long way to alleviating these concerns.

If you are concerned about your particular provider, they will be happy to explain their procedures to you.

The article is as follows:

We, as Communications Providers (CPs), commit to the following:

- **1.** We will not undertake any non-voluntary migrations to digital landlines, until we have full confidence that we are taking all possible steps to protect vulnerable people through the migration process.
- **2.** No telecare users will be migrated to digital landline services without us, the customer, or the telecare company confirming that they have a compatible and functioning telecare solution in place.
- **3.** Where battery back-up solutions are provided, we will work to provide solutions that go beyond the Ofcom minimum of 1 hour of continued, uninterrupted access to emergency services in the event of a power outage.
- **4.** We will collectively work with Ofcom and government to create a shared definition of 'vulnerable' customer groups that require greater support, specific to the digital landline migration.
- **5.** We will conduct additional checks on customers who have already been non-voluntarily migrated to ensure they do not have telecare devices we were unaware of, and if they do, ensure suitable support is provided
