New Community Asset -Introducing Huckles Meadow

The Parish Council are very pleased to announce the land transfer has now taken place. This means that the Parish Council are now the owners of the area of land off Bedford Road by the balancing bond as you enter/exit the village by the A6 roundabout.

The Parish Council have already undertaken some site meetings to discuss potential ways to improve the area, which will be discussed in more detail at forthcoming Parish Council meetings, so a clear strategy for development and improving the area can be agreed and acted upon.

Wishing to recognise this important area within the parish, and to mark its change in ownership from Bedford Borough Council to the Parish Council, it was felt fitting to give this piece of land a name by which it would be known locally, recognised by the village now, and in future generations.

The Parish Council are pleased to announce the area will be named Huckles Meadow after former resident, Borough and Parish Councillor Barry Huckle who devoted many years of service to the village and to the new community of Wixams in numerous community roles.

For safety reasons and until the area is properly fenced and landscaped (hopefully over the Summer months) the area will not be available for the public to access. Continued on page 4>>>

Bedfordshire Police Inspector Visit Feedback

Inspector Russell Goldsmith attended the April Parish Council meeting. Russell is the Inspector for the North Rural Community Team at Bedfordshire Police which covers Wilstead and surrounding village areas and he provided some really useful feedback.

In return, feedback to him included: speeding vehicles through the village, inconsiderate parking concerns particularly along Church Road, anti-social vehicle behaviour including late night racing along the A6, plus how the community may engage with the police on important local matters.

Several actions were agreed between all parties present on how to improve communications, flow of information through to the police, accessing police engagement when needed, plus information on increased Police Constable Officer numbers joining the rural community policing team to serve Wilstead and surrounding villages.

Average Speed Cameras, **Cotton End Road – Latest**

The Parish Council continue to keep pushing the local authority on progressing this scheme to enable an installation date to be shared with the community.

The responsible Environmental Engineering Team Leader at the Borough Council has recently advised: "The Cotton End Road average speed cameras are currently in design. We have held a site meeting with the contractors to discuss the works and the positions of the new cameras. We are looking to install the cameras on lamp columns to keep the amount of street furniture at the site to a minimum and reduce clutter. The existing columns are likely to require replacement to ensure they can support the loading of the cameras and provide the necessary visibility for the ASC system to function. At this stage we are looking to finalise the design works in July with construction anticipated in late summer depending on contractor and road space availability."

The Parish Council are responding promptly to the Officer's request for further information to mitigate any further delays

Handymen Wanted

The Parish Council is looking to establish a shortlist of handymen (or women) able to assist with tasks at short notice. This might be anything from a leaking tap at the Jubilee Centre, decorating, applying wood preservative to our benches, maintaining our noticeboards, helping the caretaker at the Village Hall and many other tasks in between. Payment would be at the going rate. If you have a business or are an individual with some time on their hands and

could assist, please let Lizzie, our Parish Clerk, know *(see contact details below)*. We shall then contact you for details.

Bedford Borough Council Bulky Waste Collection Service In Wilstead

At the time of writing the Parish Council have seen the draft schedule for bulky waste collection for this year provided by Bedford Borough Council, however, they have been asked not to publicise the dates until the schedule has been confirmed. As Wilstead is presently earmarked for a visit in May it is probable that the final date, time and location will only be available on the Parish noticeboards and on our website at <u>www.wilsteadparishcouncil.org</u>. This information will include more details including the types of waste that will be accepted.

Planning Applications and Breaches

The Parish Council are a statutory consultee for planning applications which means they get notified of applications in the parish. Details of these applications are circulated to the Planning Working Group who recommend a response to the full Parish Council at a Parish Council meeting.

There are certain types of applications which the Parish Council are not notified of, however, but the Parish Council as well as other stakeholders may still comment on them. These include siting of telegraph poles, broadband cabinets, lawful development certificates, plus some variations, amendments and conditions of previously approved applications.

In order to not miss out on these applications the Parish Council maintain a proactive approach, regularly reviewing the Borough Council planning portal for any application received within the parish. Members of the public can also set up notifications alerting you to any newly registered applications, to be sent to your email directly. Head to the webpage to do this: <u>www.bedford.</u> <u>gov.uk/planning-and-building-control/planningapplications/search-plans/search-plans -how to find planning</u>.

If it appears that an application is not being built to plan, the Borough Council rely fully on information being passed on to them from the public, so they can investigate.

The process to do this is really quick, simple and also totally anonymous.

Regrettably the local authority will not accept any report of breaches unless they are sent through the planning portal, so you do need to complete a form which can be found at: <u>www.bedford.gov.uk/planning-andbuilding-control/planning-guidance/report-planningbreach</u> then click on the purple box 'planning enforcement investigation'.



If you wish to be kept up to date with the investigation then it is best to kindly ask the Officer to keep you updated.

Please look out for our next quiz night date and pencil it in your diaries.



Time to Enjoy Our Gardens

So even if you have a few extra plants grown on a windowsill that are more than you need, bring them along and swap them for plants you do want. Any vegetable, flower, indoor or garden plants are welcome. Donations will be arranged in the Village Hall car park according to type and swapped after the meeting.

Plants can be in any suitable container, plant pots, yoghurt pots, disposable drink cups, but they should be in fairly dry compost. Larger split perennials or small shrubs, if bare rooted, should be well wrapped in waterproof covering to prevent any soil leaks or the plants drying out. We are hoping for a great selection.

At our April meeting we had a bumper turnout to hear Mike Stewart talk about his journey as a horticulturist training at both private estates and stately homes. These include Waddesden and Highgrove, where his home was within sight of the then Prince Charles' home. Without giving away any secrets we all enjoyed a very entertaining afternoon learning about the trials of trainees and the difficulties of horticulture, particularly keeping an ornamental hedge in perfect shape. We hope to have a return visit by Mike next year.

There will be a report on all the Public Footpaths and Bridleways in the parish. These reports will be based on inspections undertaken by members of the group.

Not only will the path's surface have been checked but also any overgrowth which is restricting movement along the path will have been identified.

Come along if you are interested in the paths around the village and fancy helping to keep an eye on them. See how the reporting process works and how the group identifies what work is required to ensure that all the paths remain usable for all the village, (without having to wade or duck!!).

Working Parties

The last Working Party installed two waymark posts on Footpath 12, which runs from the parish boundary near Medbury Farm, Elstow to join Bridleway 15 and so reach Hooked Lane, Wilstead.

On the way it junctions with Footpath 13 and so provides a link to Duck End Lane and creates a nice countryside loop / walk from there to Hooked Lane.

Hopefully the new waymark posts will make it even more difficult to get lost!!

Walks

In April, after a couple of postponements due to wet weather, the group finally managed to do the walk around Streatley / Sharpenhoe and were rewarded with great views across Bedfordshire north towards Ampthill / Clophill and the Greensand Ridge.

The next walk is planned to be on **Friday 17th May**. Meet at 6.30pm in the Village car Park off Whitworth Way. Keep an eye out for details of the walk on the village noticeboards.

All are welcome on these walks and if you are coming along please wear stout shoes or walking shoes/boots.
