### **Wilshamstead Parish Council**

#### **Major Gas Main Replacement Works Update**

The Parish Council having been advised that there will be gas main replacement works taking place on Bedford Road towards the roundabout and down along Cotton End Road as far as Ivy Lane, have at the time of writing been informed that the work will be commencing on site on 10th November 2025. Please note at present, the Parish Council have not seen any formal notification of the associated road or traffic management plans for the duration of the works. It is usual, and expected that signage giving advance notice will be in situ in advance of the works starting.

It does mean there is likely to be significant disruption caused to traffic flow and access in the village for the duration of the works. The Parish Council do believe that traffic management signals will be in place whilst this project is ongoing.

As and when more information is known from Cadent, the Parish Council will update the Wilstead community via this Newsletter, the Parish Council website and noticeboards along with social networks.

#### **Planning Application For Up To 149 Houses At Duck End Lane**

Parish Council have engaged employed the services of an experienced planning consultant to provide professional support in putting forward more technical and robust challenge to the local authority to the current planning application at Duck End Lane. The comprehensive document will be submitted as additional objection comments and representations being made by the Parish Council to the local authority.

This application remains being considered by the local authority, with a planning application number 24/01566/MAO Outline application with all matters reserved, except access, for the erection of up to 149 dwellings and associated works at Land On The East Of Duck End Lane.





As usual there continues to be a number of items going on behind the scenes at the Parish Council on a number of different local matters, below is just an example of some items being worked on:

- Marking of Remembrance with poppies displayed on street columns, donation to British Legion and attendance at Remembrance service
- Installation of additional festive lighting on street columns in the village
- Reporting a range of highways matters to the local authority Highways Helpdesk
- Follow up liaison with local authority enforcement team regarding a hazardous tree
- Support with local facility looking to improve and enhance space for community use







All it remains now is to distribute the assets including costumes, properties, scenery and lighting, which is being undertaken by a caretaker committee and to thank everyone for their support over the years.


If your group are including a Christmas Tree we are setting up on **Friday**, **28th November** from 10am.

## Wilstead Players' History

In 1970-1 when the Whitworth Way area was being developed a lot of young people moved into the village and a like-minded group of them got together and decided to form an amateur Drama Group and so the Wilstead Players was formed.

The group went from strength to strength staging a wide range of productions from serious plays such as 'The Crucible' to the more light hearted comedies of Alan Ayckbourne with Revues, Pantomimes and Olde Tyme Music Halls occurring along the way. Productions with large casts were always favourites as they involved more members and brought more of their friends and relatives into the audience. Murder Mystery evenings were also popular as they also included a 3-course meal (did people come for the drama or for the meal?)

The Players also entered Drama Festivals often winning trophies.

In order to attract young players the society held Saturday morning sessions for Juniors led by a professional drama coach. As well as productions the Players also had an active social side with after show parties (they were fun) barbecues (with burnt sausages) and quizzes. When the new village hall was built the fact that there was an active drama group meant that the players were involved with its design and now Wilstead has one of the few village halls in the area with a usable stage and wings.

Unfortunately as time passed the membership aged and dwindled. People travelled further to and from work and worked longer hours and it became increasingly difficult to attract new and younger members. Most of the founder members had passed on or moved away. Eventually it was decided at an Extraordinary General meeting to bring down the curtain for a final time after 54 years.

Who knows what the future may hold. With more people now working from home maybe they will want the social interaction, friendship, love of theatre and joy of treading the boards that an amateur drama group can provide and maybe a village drama group will rise again.
