The reason is that the passing of the Local Plan now means a material difference has occurred which allows it to do this. Planning Officers have been under pressure from Councillors to take legal advice on this which they have now done. There are only two that have progressed insufficiently for them to be able to do this and one of these is Village Farm.

### Wilshamstead Parish Council

#### **Reporting Highways Issues**

As the poor weather is continuing and this often coincides with more damage being noticed to the highways, footways and verges, it is very helpful if you spot any problems that these are reported to the Local Authority who are able to inspect the item and carry out any necessary repairs.

The best way to report issues to the Borough Council Highways Helpdesk is by emailing them on highways.helpdesk@bedford.gov.uk.

The more detail the better, including location and if possible a photo of the issue. You can also phone them on **01234 718003** this is a 24 hour a day service.

You will be given a customer report number which you can quote and keep up-to-date on the progress of the item. The Borough Council do not have the resources to keep you updated, so if you want to know what is happening you will need to contact them.

To track your item online go to https://highwaysreporting.bedford.gov.uk/.

As a guideline, here are the timescales they advise for highways repairs.

**Pot holes** – these are normally repaired within 2 days, smaller potholes are normally repaired within 6 weeks.

**Street lights** – emergency street lighting faults where there is a serious risk of injury (e.g. exposed wiring) are normally repaired within 24 hours. Non emergency faults (including operational street lights) are normally repaired within 10 days.

For non emergency other highways issues they aim to update the report within 7 working days.

It is always worth copying the Parish Council into the email you send to the Borough Council so we can spot any trends emerging and support with escalating the matter where needed. Also some of the street lights in the Parish are currently Parish Council lights, so it may be that our contractor needs to review the light and not the local authority.

#### **East West Rail Update**

The Parish Council were invited to a telephone conference to hear the announcement by Network Rail on the preferred East West Rail route for the Bedford to Cambridge section.

Shortly afterwards the information was made public with the preferred route of the line going north of Bedford. There are a number of public consultation events being held and it is important that residents engage in the consultation so your views are taken into account.

#### Wilstead Woodland (Duck End)

A big thanks to all those who braved the weather and came along to the second tranche of planting on 9th February. 175 people planted over 1500 trees.

Progress is slowly being made over the transfer of the land to the Parish Council. The initial Section 106 payment has recently been made by the Wixams developer (Gallagher) and this has been transferred to the Forest of Marston Vale.

This covers the costs associated with organising and undertaking the planting to date and should now allow tracks and paths within the woodland to be constructed.

The Parish Council has received a draft of the actual transfer document and together with the Forest of Marston Vale, who will manage the woodland for 25 years, will review and respond to it, with the help of the legal department of Bedford Borough Council.

Once the land transfer is completed and a pedestrian gate is installed it is intended to allow public access to the site.

A new Parish Council website is currently being developed so that there is a specific site for members of the public to access all Parish Council information. This useful resource will contain a plethora of items from how to contact individual Councillors, the Burial Ground rules, allotment information as well as more information on Parish Council meetings and what the Council's latest work is.



# What Happens when A Burglary is Reported?

When a call comes in, Police call handlers go through a specially designed series of questions, so they can assess the incident and how it should be actioned in the most efficient and effective way.

All victims of burglary will be visited by a Scenes Of Crime Officer to thoroughly assess any forensic opportunities.

If a burglary occurs in a frequently targeted area, or involves vulnerable victims, or there were witnesses to be followed up, it will be classed as a priority and an officer may attend to speak to the victim to gather more information.

If you spot someone behaving suspiciously, contact the police via 101 immediately. In an emergency or if a crime is in progress always call 999.

# Village P3 Footpath Group

#### Meetings

The next meeting will be on **Saturday 7th March** at 10.00am in the Village Hall (small hall).

All welcome to come along and see what we do. Perhaps you might like to report on the state of one of the Parishes 17 Rights of Way once every two months and possibly help undertake a variety of tasks to keep these paths easy to use and follow. These tasks can range from cutting back overhanging vegetation, mowing the path surface, putting up way mark discs, installing way mark posts and occasionally installing kissing gates or culverts.

Currently the other meeting dates for 2020 are Saturdays 23rd May, 18th July, 19th September and 14th November.

#### **Footpath Work**

The state of the paths at the moment has meant that any work on the paths, bar snipping off bits of overhanging vegetation, still has had to be postponed. Hopefully this will soon change and each path can be addressed to ensure they are all easily walkable.

If you discover any problems when walking these village paths please contact the number below and the group will try and sort them out.

In the meantime if you use the footpaths around the village please take secateurs with you and snip the odd overhanging vegetation as you go along.

#### Footpaths across the A6

The filling in of the 'cattle creep' under the A6 by the Borough, as part of the A6 road reconstruction, has meant that the potential for diverting Footpath 3 (Bedford Road to Houghton Conquest via the edge of Wixams), and Footpath 4 (Longmeadow Drive to Houghton Conquest), through this underpass and avoiding crossings the A6 on the level, has now gone.

It is anticipated that these footpaths will re-open at the same time as the A6. The Borough has informed the Group that there will be improved visibility at both of these crossings and each will also have 'Pedestrians Crossing' signs installed in the A6 verge nearby. Also there will be some new steps on Footpath 4 as you descend from the noise bund to the A6 and the finger post and waymark post will be re-instated.

#### Walks

The February walk was along the footpaths and bridleways between and around the villages of Ickwell and Northill. The weather was nice and sunny and the route was mainly dry underfoot with only the odd muddy bits (it had been chosen as the least muddy of the various paths that were the options). The group are repeating a walk done a while ago. This one we had mainly done in 2006.

The next walk will be on **Sunday 15th March** and will probably be around Broom. It will be 4-5 miles long and flat. Meet in Whitworth Way car park at 2.00pm.

Provisional dates for the remaining walks in 2020 are as follows **Sunday 26th April, Fridays 29th May, 26th June, 24th July, 21st August, Sundays 27th September, 25th October and 22nd November**. These will be confirmed in the Newsletter nearer the time of each walk.

So if you fancy joining a group of villagers for a sociable wander through the Bedfordshire countryside, come along. Don't worry if you don't have transport as lifts are always available.

Keep an eye out for details of all the walks on the village noticeboards nearer the time.

# **Amazon Prime Scam**

First reported in October 2019 this has cost victims more than  $\pounds 1$  million.

Victims receive an automated phone message saying they have been charged for an Amazon Prime subscription.

They are instructed to 'press 1' to cancel the transaction. When they do this, they are directed to a fraudster posing as an Amazon customer service representative.

The victim is told that their subscription was purchased fraudulently and remote access to their computer is required in order to fix a security flaw to prevent it from reoccurring.

The unsuspecting victim then downloads software which grants the scammers remote access to their computer, including personal and financial information.

Other variants of the crime involve fraudsters stating that the recipient is eligible for a refund for an unauthorised transaction on their Amazon account.

Bedfordshire Police would like to advise all residents to stay alert to this sophisticated scam and follow Action Fraud advice to stay safe.

We hope your gardens are drying out and growing with not too much storm damage.



# Speak to your Close Ones about 'Courier Fraud'

Bedfordshire Police is supporting a national campaign co-ordinated by the City of London Police targeting courier fraud and is encouraging residents to speak to their elderly friends and family about spotting the signs of impersonation fraud.

Courier fraud often starts with a cold call where the fraudster claims to be a Police Officer or a bank official. The ultimate aim of this call is to trick the victim into handing over money or bank details.

Courier fraud is typically committed by organised crime groups and targets the elderly and vulnerable, so the Police is encouraging people to speak to their relatives and ensure they're aware of the following advice:

Neither Police nor bank officials will ever ask you to withdraw money from your account, purchase anything or hand over your personal details or passwords

If you believe you are being targeted by a scammer hang up the phone and use a different phone line to call Action Fraud or the Police, as scammers have a way to stay on the line and will pretend to be the Police when you call back.

If you don't have access to a different phone line, wait for a period of time and try calling your family member or friend first to make sure the scammer is no longer on the line.

Just because someone knows basic details about you like address or date of birth, it doesn't mean they are genuine bank or police employees.

Always question suspicious phone calls and report them to Action Fraud or the police.

If you think you or someone you know has been defrauded, you can report it to Action Fraud online or by calling **0300 123 2040**.
