



- The Localism Act of 2011 introduced the "Neighbourhood Plan" which can be used to set out priorities for development at a local level.
- This gives local people the opportunity to shape the development of their community



- Wilstead is preparing a Neighbourhood Plan
- Steering Committee formed from interested villagers
- They act on behalf of the Parish Council
- Once approved the Plan will:
 - Sit within the framework of the Bedford Borough
 Council Local Plan 2030
 - Along with the Local Plan, be part of Central Government Housing strategy
 - Give the local community greater power to shape development
 - Influence planning decisions within the Parish



- The Plan must be evidence based
- This requires the Neighbourhood Plan Team to consult with the local community
- A questionnaire will be issued to all households in the village
- Discussions are taking place with local organisations, communities and businesses to determine their views and obtain their input



- The Neighbourhood Plan will bring together residents, businesses, local groups, landowners and, possibly, developers to share ideas and build consensus about needs and priorities for the Parish.
- This "bringing together" starts with discussions in which the Neighbourhood Plan Team ask for input into the process



- The approved Plan will:
 - Contain a shared vision and objectives for our neighbourhood.
 - Describe the unique character and history of the village
 - Choose if or where new development should take place
 - Identify and help protect the environment and important local green spaces.
 - Influence what new buildings should look like
 - Identify priorities for improvements to the village
