# **Wilshamstead Parish Council Bedford Borough Council Local Plan Latest**

At the time of writing the Parish Council are aware that Bedford Borough Council have called a meeting to give an update on the Local Plan document.

The Local Plan is the key strategic planning document for the Local Authority, that sets out the allocations for development as well as the associated planning policies that will be applied in terms of supporting growth with suitable infrastructure. Following on from changes announced by central government in regards to national planning policies, this has a knock on effect at local planning level, so this meeting called by Bedford Borough Council is expected to give local Parish Councils the latest on the current status.

Wilstead Parish Council are aware that there have been a lot of speculative planning applications being submitted by land owners and developers, not only in Wilstead but across Bedford Borough, so this meeting with the Local Authority will give a clear direction. Parish Councillors will be in attendance and as usual the Parish Council will look to share any relevant updates with residents across the usual platforms.

# **375 More Houses Proposed** For Wilstead...

As detailed previously, residents are probably aware of the recent planning applications for: 24/01566/MAO an outline planning application for the erection of up to 149 dwellings and associated works at land to the South East of Duck End Lane and 24/02231/MAO outline application demolition of existing buildings and erection of up to 95 residential dwellings at land at Village Farm, 85 Cotton End Road.

In early January the Parish Council were notified of a further new application for 375 houses by Wates Development for land south of Wixams which is within the parish boundary of Wilstead.





The application is for an outline planning application up to 375 homes and associated infrastructure, the application number is 24/02463/MAO.

Bedford Borough Council will be determining all three planning applications, all three applications are being considered at present, so it is really important residents engage in the planning consultation process for all these sites.

If you have not had a chance yet to engage in the consultation process and have your say for these applications, there is still time to submit comments to the Local Authority who will take them on board up until the point of determining the application. Please send your comments to planning@bedford.gov.uk

# **Parish Council Membership Update**

The Parish Council recently received a Councillor resignation from Jo Bampton, thank you to Jo for your support during your time on the Council. ### **East West Rail Public Consultation**

The consultation recently closed, thank you to those residents who took the opportunity to engage in the consultation process and fed back your thoughts and views. The Parish Council did respond to the consultation, with one of the items being highlighted was concern over the parking for the main Bedford train station being sited on part of the current Bedford Hospital car park.

# **Dog Fouling**

The Parish Council has received complaints from Allotment Holders abouts dogs fouling the pathways and tracks within the Allotments area. The track that leads to and from the Burial Ground is a 'Dogs on Leads' zone and only allotment holders may go beyond the track. Please be aware that if you are observed not clearing up after your dog you may be subject to a £75 on the spot fine or, if taken to court, subject to a £1000 fine. 



# **Suspicious Emails**

Over 32 million suspicious emails have been reported to the Suspicious Email Reporting Service (SERS), with more than a third of all emails reported in the last year, new figures reveal.

This has led to more than 329,000 websites addresses being removed by the National Cyber Security Centre. Action Fraud, the national fraud and cybercrime reporting service, launched a national phishing awareness campaign in June 2024, as reporting reached its highest level since SERS launched.

There has also been a huge number of text messages reported to 7726. In March 2024, more than 60,000 malicious websites were removed as a result of being reported using 7726.
