Wilshamstead Parish Council

Planning Permission Granted For Up To 95 Houses On Cotton End Road

Bedford Borough Council Planning Committee met on 19th May to formally consider the application 24/02231/MAO outline application demolition of existing buildings and erection of up to 95 residential dwellings at land at Village Farm, 85 Cotton End Road. The Borough Council Planning Officer had recommended in their report for the application to be approved.

Strong and robust representation was made, all in objection on the evening of the meeting by Borough Ward Councillors Marc Frost, Andrea Spice, Graeme Coombes as well as Parish Councillor Chris Carberry. Unfortunately, due to the local authority housing land supply not being at a strong enough level at present, combined with the new National Planning Policy Framework giving tilted balance to planning permission being granted for residential development it meant elected Borough Councillors were minded to grant the application planning permission. The vote taken by elected members was for the decision by the Committee to be deferred to enable further negotiations to take place. The reason for the deferral was due to consideration being given to include in the planning conditions agreed that are expected to be

applied to the application, to include a provision in the site development for bungalows to be built and the developer being required to make a financial contribution to healthcare provision improvements to serve the local area. The application will now return to a future Planning Committee of Bedford Borough Council for members to be updated and a vote to be taken.

The Parish Council are grateful for approximately 40 residents who took the time to respond to the planning application individually, voicing their opinions on the application.

With it looking highly probable this planning application will be granted permission at Cotton End Road in the very near future it will in turn set a concerning precedent for Wilstead, as well as also setting a precedent across Bedford Borough for speculative development sites outside of the Settlement Policy Area. The Parish Council did strongly reference the current Wilshamstead Neighbourhood Plan which allocates no development in the parish, using this as part of the Parish Council's submitted argument against this application to the Borough Committee members. Therefore, in light of this planning decision the Parish Council are taking pro-active action to expedite a review of the current Neighbourhood Plan to ensure it can be used effectively going forwards given the situation now Wilstead finds itself in.





East West Rail Latest

East West Railway Company (EWR Co) has published a 2024 non-statutory consultation (NSC) update that is now available to view on their website at:

https://eastwestrail.co.uk/news/lateststories/publication-of-of-2024-non-statutoryconsultation-update-report.

They have informed Parish Councils that since the consultation closed, they have been carefully considering all the feedback received as they continue to develop proposals before holding a statutory consultation next year.

The latest update they issued is intended to summarise how they approached the 2024 NSC, the levels of feedback received, emerging themes and how your feedback is being considered. It is not the purpose of the update to include detailed responses to the feedback received through the NSC process. That information will be provided in the "You Said, We Did" report which will be published at statutory consultation.

More than 6,000 people responded to EWR Co's NSC which took place between November 2024 and January 2025. They were grateful to everyone who shared their views with them.







Stay Vigilant Against Courier Fraud

The public are urged to stay vigilant and warn elderly relatives or neighbours against scammers impersonating police officers.

Bedfordshire Police has dealt with several cases of courier fraud where people have been tricked into handing over money or valuables.

Criminals are targeting the elderly or vulnerable and pretending to be from police forces across the country before asking the victim to withdraw sums of cash.

The money is then handed over at a later date to couriers who attend the victim's address to collect the goods.

In just one week in Bedfordshire, one victim lost £13,000 while another was scammed out of £48,000.

Usually suspects tell victims that they have people in police custody for cloning the victim's debit cards, they then ask the victims for their bank details and pin numbers.

Criminals may also convince the victim to transfer money to a 'secure' bank account, hand over their bank cards or give the criminals high value items, such as jewellery, watches and gold.

Another tactic used is called "open phone" where the victim is persuaded to stay on the phone to the criminal whilst they go to withdraw money or go to a jeweller. This stops the victim interacting with anyone else or having the chance to think about what is really happening.

Please remember that the police will never ask you to withdraw money for them or call you to ask for your bank details, and never ever share your debit or credit card with anyone else. They will also never ask for your jewellery to keep it safe.

You should always check the caller's credentials. Never click any email link you are unsure of or respond to any unsolicited emails or calls.

If you take a call from someone who you believe is not genuine, hang up, and contact either Action Fraud or the police. Where possible use a different phone to make the call, in case the fraudulent caller is still on the line.
